ACT LEND LTT Self-Advocate Application Due May 3, 2021

Leadership Education in Neurodevelopmental and Related Disabilities (LEND) programs train and teach graduate students, family members of people with disabilities, and self-advocates on issues that affect people with disabilities. These issues include health, education, employment, and social service systems. The purpose of the LEND training program is to improve the health of infants, children, and adolescents with autism spectrum disorder and other developmental disabilities (ASD/DD). The program accomplishes this by preparing trainees from different professional disciplines (for example, special education social work, self-advocacy) to be leaders in their fields. LEND also teaches trainees how other professions work with ASD/DD.

Applications are now being accepted for the 2021-2022 ACT LEND Program as a Long-Term Trainee at The University of Texas at Austin. This application includes information about the program and instructions for how to apply. We will include at least one self-advocate in each trainee group. By self-advocate, we mean someone who is affected by autism or a developmental disability; and who wants to learn how to advocate for themselves and others. Each trainee will complete 300 hours of training and will receive a stipend totaling \$9,000. The 300 hours can be completed over 1 or 2 years. ACT LEND Program Requirements

The Autism Consortium of Texas (ACT) LEND is based at the Steve Hicks School of Social Work at The University of Texas at Austin, in partnership with Baylor University and Texas State University. The ACT LEND Program provides training to graduate students, practicing professionals, family members and self-advocates. They learn about diagnosis, support, and advocacy for children with ASD/DD in the Capital Region and Central Texas.

Long-Term Trainees in this 9-month program must complete at least 300 hours of training and hands-on experiences. Self-advocates and family members can complete these hours over 1 or 2 years. All classes and seminars will be held on site at the Steve Hicks School of Social Work at the University of Texas at Austin and/or virtually via video conferencing. All other activities will be held in-person and/or virtually as conditions allow.

Curriculum and Training Requirements for LTTs

- Mandatory all-day ACT LEND Orientation during the week of August 16, 2021 (TBA)
- ✤ Fall Course (Tuesdays 5:30-8:30 p.m.)
- Bi-weekly clinical sessions (days/times TBA)
- Spring weekly seminars (Thursday afternoons/evenings, time TBA)
- ✤ A 100-hour clinical or community practicum
- Monthly meetings with your discipline training coordinator (including development of an individualized learning plan)
- Leadership conferences and workshops (days/times TBA)
- Meeting with a family mentor (minimum of 4 times/year)
- Engagement in a research or evaluation project
- Poster presentation of ACT LEND project on practicum or research activities at the end-of-year Open House held on May 6, 2022

Acknowledgement of Program Requirements

- ✤ I understand the program requirements of the ACT LEND Program.
- If selected, I understand that attendance at all events is required (but can be completed over a 2-year period if I choose).
- I understand that absences for professional conflicts or illness must be approved by ACT LEND faculty.
