E4Texas is part of the Texas Center for Disabilities Studies, a University Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities at the University of Texas at Austin authorized by the DD Act. Programs like E4Texas are critical to supporting the DD Act—aligning directly with the Act's goals set forth by Congress and ensuring Texans with disabilities can lead full, self-determined lives.

Make **informed choices** and decisions about their lives

E4Texas provides students with academic coursework, career pathways, and life skills education to build independence and confidence in decision-making.

Achieve **integration** by living in communities as full citizens

Students live on campus, participate in community internships, and engage with local volunteer organizations, gaining important life skills to integrate fully and responsibly into community life.





Pursue meaningful and productive lives

By earning up to 10 career certification and interning 144 hours in the spring semester, students gain marketable skills and career direction.

Contribute to their families, communities, and the nation

E4Texas emphasizes employment readiness and volunteer service, preparing students to be active contributors in a range of fields and roles.

Live **free of abuse**, neglect, and exploitation

Through training in self-advocacy, healthy relationships, and independent living, students gain skills to protect themselves—crucial, as people with disabilities face 4 to 10 times higher risk of abuse than those without disabilities.
